## **Improving Access to Healthcare Services and Special Education in Rural Communities**

The Public Health Research Initiative (PHRI) in the College of Health Sciences at Boise State University invites healthcare professionals, teachers, students, and parents to learn about Behavior Imaging and how this new technology has improved access to healthcare and special education services internationally. Specialists in the fields of autism and special education will share their experiences in using the technology in therapeutic, educational, and research settings.

Speakers will include:

- Dr. Dennis Moore, Director, The Krongold Center, and Dr. Angelika Anderson, Senior Lecturer, both of Monash University in Melbourne, Australia. Drs. Moore and Anderson will discuss their international autism treatment and research work and will illustrate the use of Behavior Imaging to conduct clinical behavior analysis remotely.
- Carol L. Scholz M.Ed. Director of Alternate Assessment, Idaho State Department of Education. Mrs. Scholz will discuss Idaho's ambitious and nation-leading effort to facilitate data collection of all Special Education students in rural schools who require alternate assessments.
- Dr. Thomas Young, Medical Director, Caring Technologies, Inc. Dr. Young will discuss the potential advantages of Behavior Imaging to improve healthcare delivery to patients who suffer from autism and other neurodevelopment development disorders
- Dr. Tyler Whitney, Clinical Director, Intermountain Center for Autism and Child Development. Dr. Whitney will discuss his clinic's role in a military funded project to increase access by military dependents to ABA Therapy using Behavior Imaging.
